MARQUETTE – Speedskaters visiting Marquette this week for the only World Cup short track event in the United States will be welcomed by decorative skates on downtown lampposts.

The International Skating Union World Cup competition will be held at Northern Michigan University (NMU) bringing the best skaters in the world from up to 30 countries.

Greeting them will be about 80 decorated wooden cutouts of speedskates displayed on lampposts along Washington and Front Streets. The cutouts were designed and built by the NMU Constructors Club, a student group.

ISHPEMING – Students at C.L. Phelps Middle School are making a major effort to welcome international short track speedskaters to Marquette County this month and to use the event as a learning experience. The students are learning about countries and other cultures. “We want to teach the students that this is not just about skating and sports, this is about community and world events,” said Principal Charleen Willey.

The school’s several activities include decorating skates for display in downtown Marquette, writing welcome letters to the athletes and their support staff, and attend some of the skate practices where a U.S. teach coach will explain different strategies and rules of the sport. All 280 of the Phelps school’s students have written and decorated welcome letters for the international speedskaters.
